Extra-Curricular Code Of Conduct

The Culver Community Schools Corporation has written and adopted the following rules so that students in extra-curricular activities from grade 9 through grade 12 will know what is expected of them and what steps will be taken if violations of these rules occur.

Self-discipline, commitment, and dedication are traits that are expected of prospective extra-curricular participants. This includes following some simple rules governing the misuse of alcohol, drugs, and tobacco.

Participation by students in extra-curricular activities is voluntary, and is provided as a privilege. In accepting that privilege, the student and his/her parent or guardian accept the responsibility that accompanies such participation as representative of the student body and school community. That responsibility places the student in a model citizenship role concerning his/her behavior, during, and after school. These requirements extend throughout the summer and penalties carry-over from junior high to high school.

Penalties will be invoked after proper due process is followed and the charged person is found to be in violation. The charges against the student will be presented by the principal or designee. The student will be given a chance to answer the charges at this time. If the student wishes to appeal the decision, he/she may do so to the superintendent and the school board.
